Overview of Proposed Grant Program: Accomack County is partnering with the Eastern Shore Community Services Board (ESCSB) to provide
outpatient, clinical behavioral health services, therapy, including case management and care coordination with access to MAT for patients with OUD and co-occurring SUD and other disorders/mental health issues. This is stemming from a pilot project proposal to provide mobile MAT services to residents of Tangier, but expanded to include all of the applicable population of Accomack, and Tangier. The County is committing direct distributions totaling \$100,813 toward the project.

Summary of Staff Review and Recommendations
Accomack will continue its existing agreement with the ESCSB beyond the current agreement period through 10/31/2023 to hire three positions to expand access to substance use treatment services. These include qualified/credentialed clinical and peer recovery staff to support behavioral health outpatient treatment for patients with OUD/SUD and co-occurring disorders; provide care coordination via substance use case managers, and healthcare navigator services. This is a county-wide initiative.
In addition, to serve an isolated, under served community suffering the impacts of the opioid epidemic and with limited access to treatment, the ESCSB proposes to provide air transport to the individuals of Tangier Island who are seeking SUD treatment to the mainland of the Eastern Shore via Melfa Airport where the ESCSB mobile clinic and treatment will be stationed nearby at Eastern Shore Community College, including MAT, therapy, and peer recovery management and healthcare navigator services.
While the County has committed to use all opioid settlement funds exclusively for abatement purposes, it has elected to not apply for the OAA's Gold Standard Incentive.
Staff recommends full approval.
