Overview of Proposed Grant Program: 1. Peer Recovery Drop-in Center with peer recovery specialists on site to provide targeted outreach in
communities, operating as a club-house model but incorporating allowable harm reduction activities and acting as a safe haven for for those suffering from SUD/OUD. 2. Enhance existing Jail-based MAT program by adding two additional staff members to screen for SUD/OUD, and provide substance use and mental health counseling for newly diagnosed and existing patients/inmates in need of treatment and those actively receiving MAT.

Summary of Staff Review and Recommendations
1. Peer Recovery Drop-in Center - The City of Hampton in partnership with the Hampton-Newport News Community Services Board (HNNCSB) would open a Drop-in Center as an element of a comprehensive Peer Recovery Oriented System of Care with two goals: 1) to expand outreach and service accessibility to those with SUD/OUD. Serves as a non-clinical place where residents can receive information and education about SUD/OUD and co-occurring mental health issues from individuals with lived experience. Estimated to serve 250 individuals, with an estimated 10% pursuing treatment. Plans to distribute 500 harm reduction kits (includes Narcan and overdose prevention education); and 2) Expand education to help prevent SUD/OUD overdoses and deaths, partnering with community partners (churches, colleges, hospitals, etc.) and conducting community events. 2. Jail-Based MAT Services - The City of Hampton will extend the partnership with the Hampton City Jail (HCJ) and the HNNCSB to add two staff members to screen inmates for substance use upon jail entry, conduct mental heath assessments, provide counseling and treatment to such individuals while incarcerated, and link individuals to re-entry services. This would complement the existing MAT program under contract between the HCJ and HNNCSB, in existence since October 2021.
The City has applied for the OAA's Gold Standard Incentive. Staff recommends full approval.
