Prior to the funding from the National Opioid Settlement, the City of Suffolk has had minimal involvement with opioid abatement. Due to this fact, the City's Department of Social Services is in need of a Needs Assessment to determine the best use of the opioid settlement funds. Though certain community needs can be assessed from our municipal agencies (such as the courts and police) the overall opioid abatement needs for the City have never been assessed and is currently undetermined. Using the outcomes from the Needs Assessment, the City's Department of Social Services (DSS) is planning to allocate the opioid funds by awarding mini grants to departments and non-profits and tackle the epidemic where the largest needs exists. Performance evaluations will be conducted yearly to weigh the efficiency of our grant fundings and to determine effectiveness of the programs funded We are asking for planning funding for three areas of our project: Needs Assessment: There are two City employees assigned to work on the Opioid Abatement Project. There are no in-house resources or adequately knowledgeable city staff to conduct this assessment. By outsourcing this assessment, the Department of Social Services and the City as a whole are doing their due diligence in determining the best possible opportunities to aid our City with the opioid epidemic. Grants Management Initial Implementation: In order to effectively track and monitor funding of the mini grants fiscally and track performance data, the City will need a Grants Management/Project Tracking software that will integrate with our City's ERP. This is especially important since this is an 18 year project with compliance reporting. By implementing this software in the planning stages, we will be ready to begin the mini grants process upon completion and review of the needs assessment. Website/Application Software Initial Implementation: The City will also need a vessel for the public to view information regarding the City's opioid project and the distribution of this funding. A website will be built by the contracted City website providers and will be linked to the City of Suffolk website. Organizations or individuals who wish to apply for a mini grants will be able to get application information and apply through the website The overall goal is to best provide funding where it would be the best benefit for our community to remediate the opioid.
