| Summary of Staff Review and Recommendations   |
| After review of the application, staff reached out to Botetourt County for some modifications to  |

After review of the application, staff reached out to Botetourt County for some modifications to the application based on a previously awarded OAA planning grant of similar population size, scope of services, and funding required for the planning effort. This project would be centered around working with professional consulting services to guide the county in developing a strategic opioid abatement plan that would integrate early intervention/prevention,evidence-based treatment, criminal justice diversion, employment services, recovery support services, housing support, and re-entry programs. The plan would identify community stakeholders, financial planning,and various other strategic elements to include but not limited to collection and analysis of data, decision-making framework, fiscally sustainable strategic plan, performance measures/outcomes to measure progress, and recommended project that would best serve the needs of the county with financial supports available.

The OAA staff proposed a total project cost of \$50,000 with a 10% match from the County of \$5,000, which would result in an OAA request of \$45,000. The county responded and accepted the proposed modification to their application. Staff recommends the modified proposal for an OAA award of \$45,000 with a contingency that any RFPs issued will include cooperative procurement language.
