2023 Shatterproof Advocacy Priorities

Behavioral Health Integration: Ensure payment models support quality, integrated treatment. Coverage of the Collaborative Care Model is a key opportunity.

Training and Education: Ensure all healthcare professionals are trained in addiction care, including MAT.

Opioid Settlement Funds: Ensure there is a transparent process for how funds are spent at the state level, and that they are spent on evidence-based interventions to save lives.

Fentanyl Policy Framework: Ensure states have policies in place that reflect the best practices for addressing synthetic opioids like fentanyl, including: data collection and reporting, prevention programs and public education, harm reduction, and public health / public safety partnerships.

treatment and equal opportunities to thrive.





Prevention

The Intersection of Prevention & Harm Reduction Efforts

PREVENTION

PRIMARY

Preventing the initial use of or the delay of initial substance use

SECONDARY

Early detection of or reduction of substance use once problems have already begun

TERTIARY

Reducing substance use problems or harms to prevent further deterioration or death.

HARM REDUCTION



Program Search

This interactive search enables you to identify Blueprints certified interventions based on specific criteria and then browse through a wide range of interventions that match those criteria. Select only a few criteria of importance, as the number of interventions may be reduced by selecting multiple items ACROSS categories, or increased by selecting multiple items WITHIN categories.

Model and Model Plus programs are listed separately from Promising programs. This is because only Model and Model Plus programs have demonstrated efficacy for changing outcomes over time and are recommended for large scale implementation. Promising programs show promise of efficacy, but require follow-up research before being recommended for large scale adoption.

4 PILLARS OF LASTING RECOVERY















STIGMA plays a significant role in creating a devastating public health crisis.

- 1. Stigma prevents many people with a substance use disorder from seeking treatment;
- 2. Stigma limits the ability of institutions and providers to offer help when someone seeks assistance by limiting resources and perpetuating harmful policies; and
- 3. Stigma fuels a feeling of shame that serves as an obstacle to long-term health, whether or not the individual has received treatment.



Less than 50% of Americans are willing to have a person in recovery from a substance use disorder marry into their family.



88% of Americans believe employers should provide opportunities for a person with a substance use disorder to seek treatment and stay employed.



46% of Americans with an opioid use disorder expressed feeling ashamed of themselves.



74% of Americans agree more healthcare providers should offer MOUD.

Types of Stigma

Public Stigma

Public Stigma is society's negative attitude toward a group of people, creating an environment where individuals feel unwelcome, judged and blamed.

Structural Stigma

Structural Stigma includes systems-level discrimination caused by institutional policies and/or dominant cultural norms.

Self-Stigma


Self-Stigma occurs when individuals accept societal stereotypes and experience reduced self-esteem and self-efficacy.

Stigma Against MOUD

Medications for Opioid Use Disorder (MOUD) are effective, clinically proved treatments that help people in their recovery. People recover differently - one way people recover is with MOUD.
