#### Medically-assisted Treatment: Myths vs. Facts

Medically-assisted treatment, or MAT, are medications that can be used in combination with behavioral therapy, or other forms of treatment, to treat Opioid Use Disorder (OUD).


#### Change the Conversation

### Just Say Know

- Neuroscience -focused substance use education curriculum
- Led by Virginia Tech Students
- Protective factors and risk factors
- Empowers youth to make informed decisions
- Pre and post surveys



#### **JUST SAY KNOW**



The "Just Say Know" program, developed by the MUSC Youth Collaborative, is a neuroscience-focused substance use prevention program designed to empower youth with the scientific knowledge needed to make informed decisions about substance use.



**Just Say Know incorporates** opioid-specific content to address the ongoing opioid epidemic, which has significantly affected youth both in South Carolina and nationwide.

#### SUBSTANCE USE

Just Say Know provides education on the risks of various substances, including alcohol, cannabis, nicotine, and opioids such as fentanyl.



#### THE DEVELOPING BRAIN

Neuroscience-based insights into how the adolescent brain is developing and how substance use affects that development.



#### **EMPOWERMENT**

Strategies on how to say no and advice for making informed, healthy decisions about substance use.

#### LOGISTICS



The presentation is designed to last 1 hour (45 minutes of content, 15 minutes for questions and discussion), but can be adjusted to meet time constraints.



Just Say Know can be presented to audiences of any size. It is suitable for classrooms, lecture halls, or other educational spaces equipped for presentations.

#### WHY CHOOSE JUST SAY KNOW?

By participating in the Just Say Know program, schools can:

- Positively influence school-wide awareness and behaviors regarding substance use.
- · Address a critical public health issue impacting youth in the Charleston community.
- · Complement science curriculum with neuroscientific research findings on brain development.

#### SUBSTANCES DISCUSSED:



#### **ALCOHOL**

Alcohol-containing beverage such as beer, liquor, mixed drinks, and wine.



#### **CANNABIS**

Products derived from the cannabis plant consumed via joints/blunts, vape pens,



#### **NICOTINE**

Products containing nicotine like cigarettes, e-cigarettes/vaping devices, and smokeless tobacco products.



#### **OPIOIDS**

A class of drugs including fentanyl,

# Demystifying Substance Use and Harm Reduction


- Multi -day, in person, curated curriculum

- Utilized peer experiences






#### Pre- and Post-Training Surveys Conducted







### Do you know anyone, personally, who has struggled with substance use?


