


Why Collegiate Recovery Programs?

- Providing Support to a high risk, high potential population






Continuum of care


What challenges have they faced?



- 35.3% overdosing
- 82.9% family history of substance use disorders
- 46.6 % criminal justice system involvement
- 64.3% academic disruption




